Homeswest applications needed to support units

People over 55 currently living in rental accommodation in Walpole are being urged to lodge an application as soon as possible with Homeswest. The application is not binding, but the more applications there are, the more likely it is that Homeswest will help build rental units in the town for senior citizens.

Gail Laing, a member of the committee which is working towards having independent living units for the elderly in Walpole, said a partnership between the committee and Homeswest would be very advantageous.

"We need people to apply to justify the partnership with Homeswest," Gail said. "Applications are on a first-come-first-served basis and we really want local people to be at the top of the list."

Gail said the committee had only recently learned about the possibility of such a partnership and it was important for interested people to act quickly. Meanwhile the committee is moving steadily towards achieving its aims.

It has submitted an application for Incorporation under the new name "Walpole and Districts Seniors Accommodation" (WADSA) and is developing a business plan with financial support from the South West Development Commission.

Discussions have been held with the Department of Architecture at UWA to involve its students in the design of a concept plan for the independent living units.

As reported in the Weekly last week, the CRG would like an "ideal" solution, but agrees the woodlot option is the next best answer.

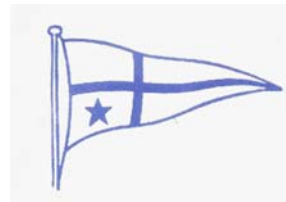
"On behalf of the Corporation and in particular the Walpole wastewater project team, I would like to thank all CRG and community members for their ongoing commitment to this important project," Chris said. "

"Further detailed planning will now follow with consideration given to the CRG report as well as technical and environmental issues, and the Corporation will continue to work closely with the community when a final proposal is developed."

Drinking water

Mr Elliott said preliminary planning investigations for long term drinking water source options were now underway, and the Corporation would be seeking community input to the process as soon as basic data was at hand.

Development of a long term water supply solution for Walpole would take a number of years, and the Corporation would be working to ensure the community's needs could be met in the interim.

“Get on board Shire’s icon project,” De Campo urges

Expressions of interest for the development of “icon” structures in towns in the Shire of Manjimup to mark the Shire’s centenary next year, have to be lodged by August 17th. Constable Andrew Curtis reported that Main Roads have funds to install rumble strips on the highway where speed limits reduce from 70km to 50km. These matters will be considered further.

Entries will be displayed soon at the Walpole Library with judging taking place at a later date. Dave Tapley advised that action on linking the town walk trail behind the hotel has been held up due to the weather and waiting on written confirmation from Native Title.
